HATCH WARREN SCOUT GROUP

We've just completed our first month since our expansion, and what a rewarding month it's been!

The Beavers and Cubs attended the St George's Day Parade - St George is the patron saint of Scouting – and we were very proud of them parading alongside the rest of the District.

BEAVERS Well we've certainly kept our Beavers busy this month. The children were particularly keen on knot making given they got to eat their strawberry lace creations. We held an interactive first-aid evening covering simple first aid and discussing what to do if somebody has an accident. THE PORTSMOUTH ARMS

Our dear reader knows that it isn't always necessary to travel miles to find a good hostelry for pub food when there is the Portsmouth Arms on the doorstep.

Madam and I haven't visited for some time so it was with a bit of questioning on our part that eventually we decided to renew our acquaintance with this impressive looking building that in reality is much younger than it appears. On a small brass plaque on a pillar near the bar it explains that it wasn't completed until 1997. It then, of course, had to be rebuilt after a fire caused considerable damage.

Although it was a sunny day there was a bit of a wind blowing so eating outside was not our choosing although we could not use the dining room on the left of the bar as a funeral wake was shortly expected. As it was getting on for a quarter to two most of the lunch trade had departed so we had virtually an empty bar area to ourselves although others came in later. This is an interesting construction, with the inside of this pub matching the outside old world design. It has large flag stone flooring and many upright wooden pillars apparently supporting the ceiling. Several nooks and crannies, and a raised platform provide room for many tables and chairs. We sat on an old settle which creaked alarmingly.

The menu is a bit different from what you see in most pubs as they have clearly gone slightly up market. There are starters with half a dozen selections from cheesy croquettes through spicy meat balls on toast, which must require a steady hand to bring to the table, to potato skins. What is described as "pub classics" starts with beef short ribs, although they had sold out when I wanted to place our order; coq au vin through to British ham and eggs with the ubiquitous chips. Fish lovers have fish pies, traditional beer battered fish and chips, but interestingly no scampi. There are four types of pies and various burgers.

Madam decided to go for an 8 oz rump steak, medium rare, with garden peas, mushroom, tomato and seasoned chips (£12.75) whereas I, as a second choice having been thwarted with initial selection of beef short ribs, chose lamb tagine. This was Moroccan style braised lamb with spicy couscous, pickled red onion and toasted pitta bread (£12.15). We were both delighted with what arrived at our table and the quality was excellent.

Puddings. Now that is the question – whether to indulge or not. Eventually, and based on the premise that we will not be having much to eat tonight, we both succumbed to temptation. I had a treacle sponge and custard served in a mini frying pan (£5.65) and madam a coffee and walnut panna cotta presented in a small Kilner jar (£5.65). Very enjoyable.

As we had pint of lager and a large diet tonic water we did not need a coffee, although quite a tempting selection was on offer. All in all it cost over £40 for our lunch but we felt it was good value having enjoyed it so much. We could see two dog water bowls so they encourage pets and families to come in. A nice touch.

KEMPSHOTT CONSERVATION GROUP

Down Grange delay, but better late than never

After a number of delays and false starts, mainly due to the wet weather in March and early April, grass cutting in strips on Down Grange Meadow finally got underway.

To avoid the ground looking rather bare for a long period over the winter months, this is the second year that grass has been left uncut until the spring. A spring cut when the grass will soon be growing again results in a much quicker recovery and, as the grass has died back over winter, the amount of cut grass to be processed is very much reduced.

The same technique as last year was used with uncut strips being left for the benefit of the many field voles and other vertebrates that populate the area.

Catch us if you can.....

We have started doing regular "pitfall" trapping to see what invertebrates inhabit our conservation sites. This involves burying a number of small containers, typically the size of a vending machine cup, with the lip of the container at ground level to prevent anything that falls in from climbing out. The containers are then covered to stop vertebrates, such as mice and voles, from falling in.

The containers have a small amount of dilute monopropylene glycol, a safe version of car anti-freeze. This solution quickly kills and preserves the invertebrates, avoiding the real risk of a carnivore, probably a spider, from making a meal of the captured specimens. The traps are left out for 24-36 hours before checking, emptying and identifying the contents.

Our start at the end of April was during the coldest spell for some time. The miserable weather limited the number and variety of "victims" that we caught. Our main interest is in insects, but we caught precious few of these. Our specimens were mainly made up of slugs, woodlice, millipedes, spiders and the odd ant. We also had a few specimens, which could only be classified as "what on earth is that". We think some of these tiny creatures, about 1-2mm long, were Springtails or Collembola. These are not true insects, but they live in the soil in huge numbers. They are very difficult to identify and an ecologist colleague of ours said an electron microscope is needed to identify them down to species level. He wished us the best of luck. A project for the future, perhaps?

LANDLORDS AND TENANTS TAKE NOTE!

Landlords and tenants are often required to give notices to one another, but preparing and serving notices can be a minefield, with plenty of room for mistakes. Innocent and minor errors can potentially invalidate the notice, and may prove expensive. As notices often give rise to rights and obligations, it is important to ensure that any notice you serve is valid, or consider whether any unwanted notice you receive is, in fact, valid.

The basic rule is that the form (which may be contractually or statutorily prescribed), the content (such as the recipient(s) and dates in the notice), the method of service and the required time for service of a notice must all be correct in order

for a notice to be valid. If there are any defects in the way in which the notice is prepared or served, it cannot automatically be relied upon and may be challenged by the recipient.

The rules are slightly different for every kind of notice and there is a lot to think about, in addition to any conditions that may be required to be satisfied prior to, upon or after service of a notice. As a consequence, we suggest that you should seek legal advice at an early stage if contemplating giving any notice to ensure that you are able to satisfy all conditions, as well to ensure that any notice served is valid. We would also recommend seeking legal advice should you wish to challenge the validity of a notice that you receive.

COUNCILLOR UPDATE

MOTORWAY SERVICE AREA:

As of now (mid May) there is still no indication of when we can expect a full planning application for the proposed motorway service area close to Hatch Warren and Beggarwood. A parliamentary petition against both this proposal and the one at Junction six was handed in last month, the petition attracted around 3000 signatures, the majority of which were from this area. As soon as any application is lodged, it is really important for everyone opposing it to register comments against. I will keep updating here and in the Gazette.

PLANNING:

At time of writing Officers at BDBC were expecting the planning application for the development of the Island Site at Beggarwood, which includes proposals for a pub/restaurant as well as older persons housing and care facility, to go to the Council's Development Control Committee for a decision either late May or more probably in June.

Proposals and details are also expected soon for Hounsme Fields, which already has outline planning permission. The development is expected to be around 750

houses plus a primary school, community centre and nursery as well as provision for two gypsy and traveller caravan pitches.

It is believed that the members at the Golf Club, which is also slated for development, are still considering their options following the decision not to move the club to Test Valley, but there is no suggestion that they are likely to change their decision to sell the land for development.

ROADS:

Hampshire County Council are still working up proposals for changes to the Brighton Hill roundabout as part of the A30 corridor improvement scheme. I will pass on any further details as soon as I have them.

DIGESTER:

Tamar, the previous operators of the Anaerobic Digester, have sold the business on to Biogen, who have acquired all five of Tamar's facilities. Biogen are now one of the largest operators of AD plants and there is a new management structure in place at the digester. At the time of writing we were about to have a meeting of the Digester Liaison Panel so I will update everyone next time if there is anything new to report.

PROBUS HEARS ABOUT LIFE AS AN APPRENTICE

"Learn a trade, son" was the advice Probust Club member David Wickens received from his father. Like many about to leave school in the Swinging Sixties, he had no clear idea of what to do with the rest of his life. Besides, these were exciting times and there were many distractions.

All around could be seen the Beatles, Elvis Presley, the death of Marilyn Monroe, the assassination of President Kennedy, James Bond films, Twiggy with miniskirts and men with long hair and flared trousers not forgetting England winning the World Cup. But what to do?

An uncle showed him how with the right instruments it was possible to simultaneously test fifty points of a jet engine fan blade. An interest was sparked and the idea of getting an apprenticeship in engineering was forming.

Apprentices have been around for thousands of years as a way of a master craftsmen passing on his secret arts and skills to the next generation. The young person was "indentured" to the master for many years with onerous conditions, any failure of which could have significant repercussions.

Needless to say the restrictions placed on indentured apprentices of yesteryear of not visiting playhouses and taverns, gambling, committing fornication or marrying did not apply to the speaker during his five years with day release at technical college and night school. A company in the Cambridge Instrument group was the benefactor of the speaker's ambitions having told the managing director at interview, that his job looked attractive.

Like apprentices in all trades he was subject to the usual initiations by the "timed served" tradesmen. Sending him for a tin of elbow grease or a bag of bubbles for the spirit levels, having his tools welded to the bench or having parts of his anatomy painted with marking blue dye was all to be endured. The only consolation was that he could look forward to applying the same rituals to the next incoming apprentice.

To enhance his appreciation of how the instruments made by his company were used in the wide world visits were arranged to some customers. The David Brown factory in Newport Pagnell, was home of Aston Martin and Lagonda, the super cars of the 60s. Here he heard about the Aston Martin DB5 used by James Bond in the film

Goldfinger in 1964 when six body shells were needed for various scenes.

The Royal Small Arms factory in London had produced swords, muskets and from 1895 onwards the famous Lea Enfield rifle which was greatly admired for the interchange ability of parts, its firing range and the competitive cost due to mass production.

The first large scale plant David visited as part of his apprenticeship was to the Dungeness "A" Nuclear Power station. This was a Magnox reactor with a capacity of 500 MW which could power 10% of Britain's electrical needs.

Stewarts & Lloyd's steel works at Corby was almost self sufficient from open cast mining of the iron ore using huge excavators with buckets that could carry 11 cubic metres of ore transported to the blast furnaces for ingot production and eventual tube manufacture.

A visit to Heathrow airport to tour the BOAC Pilot Training School allowed him to try out the Boeing 747 - 136 Flight Simulator and visit the hangers to watch aircraft being serviced using instruments David was training to make.

David Wickens was clearly good at his job, achieving the award of apprentice of the year. To demonstrate some of the skills learned in the early part of his apprenticeship he brought along some of the hand tools he had made in those years

Further experiences were developed in Work Study and Production Engineering, then in the Drawing Office where draughtsmen used pencil and paper well before the advent of CAD technology and eventually into Sales and Marketing. This latter area held him for the rest of his career as he progressed to become Export Manager visiting many manufacturing plants throughout the World.

And it all started the day he saw a fan blade being tested.

TIE UP YOUR FINANCES WHEN YOU DIVORCE

It is very important to tie up your finances when you divorce or separate from your partner.

A case that was in the headlines a couple of years ago involved a new age traveller turned eco-millionaire who refused to pay a financial award to his former wife.

Dale Vince and Kathleen Wyatt separated in 1984 and finally divorced in 1992. Mr Vince later went on to establish wind power firm Ecotricity in 1995 and became a millionaire.

In 2011 Ms Wyatt brought a financial claim against her former husband – 19 years after the Decree Absolute was granted. At the time of the divorce both had little money and Ms Wyatt continued to live off a low income while caring for their son.

There is a common misconception that when a marriage ends the Decree Absolute brings to a close the financial relationship between a couple. However, this is not the case as in the UK there is no statutory time limit to bring an application

for a financial settlement for a divorce.

The case of Wyatt v Vince shows the potential implications of not pursuing a clean financial break at the time of divorce.

It took five years for the case to progress through the Family Courts in a drawn out and expensive litigation case, where Ms Wyatt eventually was awarded £300,000.

This clearly highlights the importance of ensuring a financial agreement is reached and approved as part of the divorce process.



- The weather seems to have brightened up in recent weeks and hopefully, by the time this edition of the Rabbiter is published we'll be enjoying some summer!
- There will be a good number of young people in the midst of exams and trying to get through the month, ready to breathe a sigh of relief when they're over. Teachers will then anxiously await the results as so much in this day and age depends on how pupils perform under pressure – years of teaching coming down to a couple of hours under very precise circumstances. And then there is the preparing for a new intake and for everything to begin again.
- When I was at school I had a rough time. I hated it and didn't work towards my exams, thinking that shutting myself in my room with books open on a desk would somehow magically shift the information into my head. I'm not a natural academic and still, to this day, find study and memorising things challenging. I'd like to think that if I was able to have coursework contribute to my overall result I would have done a little better – I'm not so sure!
- We place so much pressure on a moment in time. The moment that will decide someone's future potentially. Towards the end of May Christians all over the world celebrated the feast of Pentecost – the moment when the Holy Spirit descended upon the followers of Jesus gathered and gave them the strength and power to go and proclaim the Good News of Jesus. If only revising and exams were that easy!
- Leading up to Pentecost, in the time between Ascension Day and Pentecost there was the national initiative of 'The Kingdom Come' where the church across the country (not just the Church of England but many churches) encouraged people to pray – to pray those first words of the Lord's Prayer 'Thy Kingdom come', acknowledging that much can and could be achieved through prayer.
- I'm preparing a number of children for baptism at the moment and a question I often ask them is 'what is prayer?' It's not a question to catch anyone out but one just to get them thinking.
- We often think of prayer as something quite formal, but it needn't

be. I introduce the thought that many of us have a close or best friend, or number of friends that we would share our thoughts with, share our news and challenges with – and that is how prayer should be; sharing our thoughts, challenges, happiness with God. In prayer we ask for help and guidance on anything. God wants to be that friend, that best friend we can confide in; who is there when we have something to celebrate but also there to guide us during challenging times – we only need to ask.

So, as our young people sit in the midst of their exams perhaps not knowing what the future may bring, we pray for God to be with them, to guide them, to lead them and to help them at this time and to help show them the way as well as reassuring them that whatever the results may be our young people are all made in the image of God and are loved by Him.

And for our teachers and all who work in our educational establishments, we thank God for their hard work and dedication and all they do to guide our young people through this stage of their lives. THANK YOU!

When the London overspill development started in Basingstoke in the 1960s South Ham was one of the first to be built. The estate included Russell Howard Park, named after a local Councillor, as a recreation area with football and cricket pitches, tennis courts and two bowling greens. The pavilion was manned by a Park Keeper and the facilities were intended for public hire.

This is where Howard Park Bowling Club was born and in 1969 a group of local residents, encouraged by a local Councillor, named Jim Balding, decided to form a bowling club with the intention of entering a team in the Basingstoke League. Howard Park Bowling Club had the choice of both greens and chose the bottom one, their current home.

From starting with just 15 members the club quickly established itself and in 1970 became a member of the Basingstoke league.

The club quickly grew, both in playing numbers and facilities. A maximum of 120 players was soon achieved and a prefabricated clubhouse was erected by the members in 1978. This was great

improvement on the very basic facilities that the members had become accustomed to. Now the members enjoy some of the best facilities in the area with a very comfortable air conditioned clubhouse.

In 2009, the Club's 40th playing season, a new lease was negotiated with the council for a further 21 years. So after a period when membership numbers have proved difficult within the game, for all clubs, Howard Park Bowling Club is pleased to see its membership growing once again and looks forward to the future with growing confidence.

Hope springs eternal that more people will wish to take up the sport that is so deceptively simple but is sufficiently complex in its subtleties to give a lifetime of pleasure. It is also a nice way to meet some new friends. Age or ability is not a problem i.e. 14 to 140 years and if anyone has a mobility problem we have a special wheelchair. Why not give it a try? 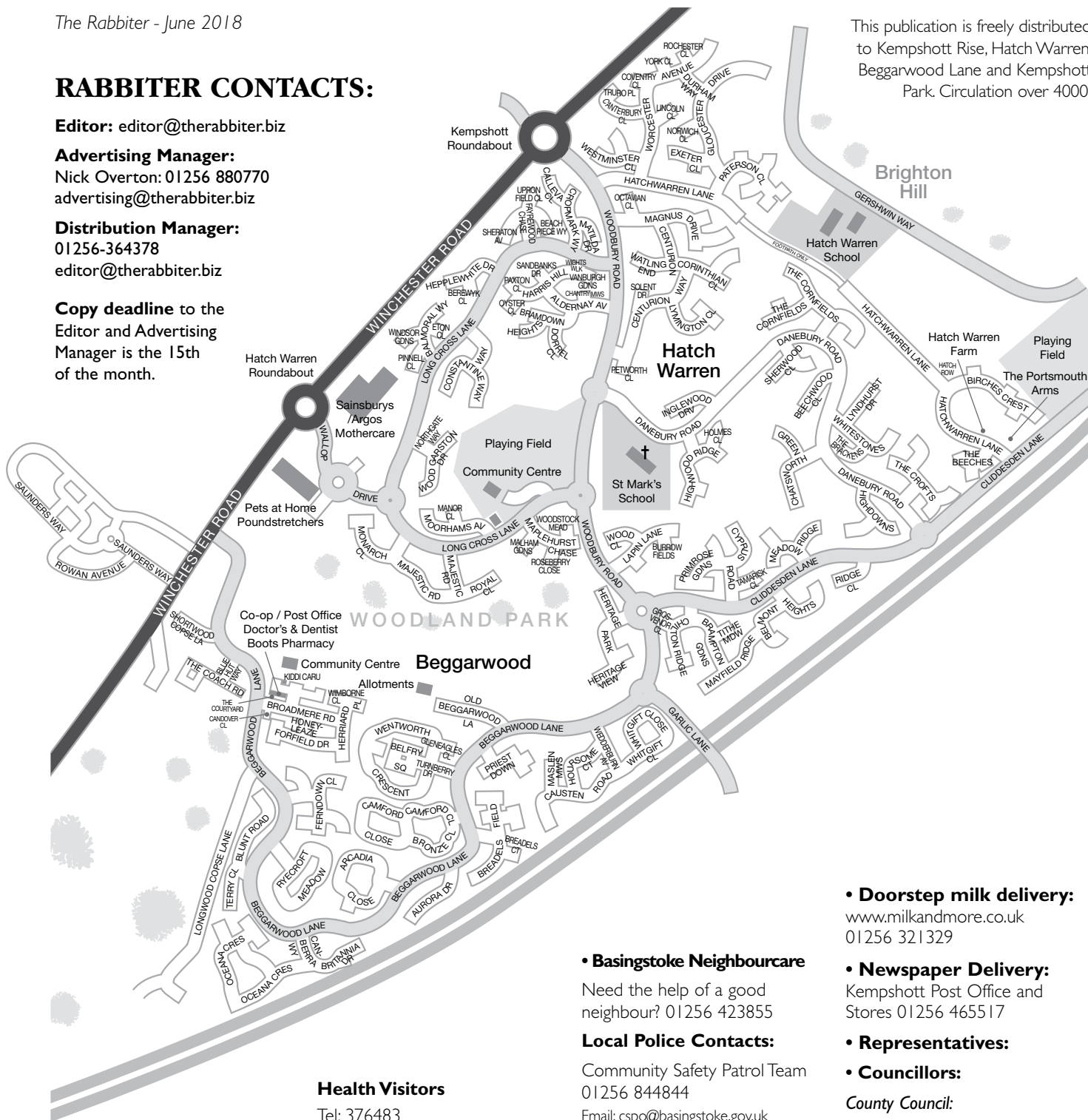

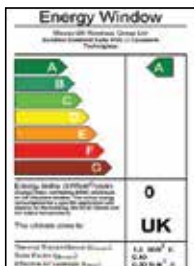
