Our first meeting was a huge success and we have had so many bookworms join

Our first book was 'Eleanor Oliphant is completely fine' which is a novel about loneliness and one young woman's struggle. It's a book which we all enjoyed and promoted a great discussion amongst the group.

Our second book was more of a challenge and not one which many would have chosen to read. 'A Gentleman in Moscow' tells the story of a count in Russia who is put under house arrest in the Hotel Metropole in Moscow. This is what the bookworms is all about, trying a different book.

Our book for February is the 'Tattooist of Auschwitz' so you have time to get reading and enjoy a book that you may not have considered reading.

We tend to meet on the last Wednesday of every month at 7.30pm and would love some new bookworms to come and join us!
