

COMMUNITY VOLUNTEERS WORKING HARD TO SUPPORT VULNERABLE RESIDENTS

The Basingstoke and Deane Community Hub has taken over 1,200 calls from vulnerable borough residents following the launch of a new coronavirus helpline.

Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council is working in partnership with Hampshire County Council, Basingstoke Voluntary Action (BVA) and community and voluntary groups to ensure that those most at risk can stay inside their homes and receive deliveries of food and prescribed medication during the COVID-19 outbreak.

The Coronavirus Hampshire Helpline has been set up for residents who are at higher risk from the virus, are self-isolating and do not have access to any help from family and friends to register for support. The helpline is available seven days a week, from 9am to 5pm by calling 0333 370 4000.

Basingstoke and Deane Community Hub, through a wide range of community and voluntary groups and volunteers across the borough, has been able to purchase and deliver food packages, collect medical prescriptions from local pharmacies and signpost residents in need to other support available.

Deputy Leader and Cabinet Member for Communities, Culture and Partnerships Cllr Simon Bound said: "These figures show how important this vital work is to provide urgent support to vulnerable residents across our borough and I would like to thank the hundreds of volunteers working hard to support residents most in need.

"We have received some great feedback from people who have been helped by volunteers and we are pleased to have been able to provide financial assistance to keep this support running during this pandemic.

"If you need support, or know anyone who is vulnerable and has no other access to help, please call the Coronavirus Hampshire Helpline to register for this service so we can ensure you get the supplies you need."



THE PORTSMOUTH ARMS BREAKS WORLD RECORD IN AID OF LOCAL CHARITY

Richard Curtis, General Manager of the Portsmouth Arms pub in Basingstoke, has broken the Guinness World Record for the world's longest marathon as a quiz master.

Following a 34-hour and 11-minute virtual quiz, Richard raised more than £21,000 for The Pink Place Cancer Charity in Basingstoke. Thousands of people joined the live stream quiz on the pub's Facebook page to support the chosen charity.

Richard's record-breaking charity quiz marathon comfortably beat the previous world record holder, Jason Hinkledire from the USA. Jason broke the record on April 12, 2014 following a 33-hour and eight-minute quiz in Pennsylvania.

Richard explained: "I am so grateful for everyone who took the time to support our cause and help us raise an incredible amount of money for The Pink Place Cancer Charity, while breaking a record attempt in the process."

Richard has hosted daily virtual pub quizzes since the Government-enforced lockdown began and has raised over £40,000 to date for many local charities including St. Michael's Hospice, Basingstoke Foodbank and Hampshire Medical Fund.



Richard added: "From what started out as an idea to create a virtual pub quiz to help people stay in and stay connected, I am incredibly humbled by the continuous support I have received and how it has grown. Without the support of my local community and people's generosity from across the globe, I wouldn't have been able to give back to these amazing local causes."

FAVOURITE RECIPES FROM CAFÉ IN THE PARK

Lemon Drizzle Traybake

Equipment and preparation: for this recipe you will need a 30x23cm/12x9in tray bake or roasting tin. Each serving provides 290 kcal, 4g protein, 38.5g carbohydrates (of which 25g sugars), 13.5g fat (of which 8g saturates), 0.7g fibre and 0.6g salt.

Ingredients

For the shortbread

225g/8oz butter or baking spread at room temperature, plus extra for greasing

225g/8oz caster sugar

275g/10oz self-raising flour

2 level tsp baking powder

4 free-range eggs

4 tbsp milk

2 unwaxed lemons, finely grated zest only

1 heaped tbsp very finely chopped lemon verbena (optional)

For the glaze

175g/6oz granulated sugar

2 lemons, juice only

Method

Preheat the oven to 180C/160C Fan/Gas
4. Grease the tin with butter and line the base with baking paper.

2 Measure all the ingredients into a large bowl and beat for 2 minutes, or until well blended. Turn the mixture into the prepared tin and level the top.

3 Bake for 35–40 minutes, until the cake has shrunk a little from the sides of the tin and springs back when lightly touched with a fingertip in the centre of the cake.

4 Meanwhile, make the glaze. Mix the sugar with the lemon juice and stir to a runny consistency.

5 Leave the cake to cool for 5 minutes in the tin, then lift out, with the lining paper still attached, and place on wire rack set over a tray.

6 Brush the glaze all over the surface of the warm cake and leave to set. Remove the lining paper and cut into slices to serve.



Recipe Tips

Tip 1: It is important to spoon the glaze on to the cake while it's still warm so the lemon juice soaks in properly.

Tip 2: Lemon balm works well as an alternative for lemon verbena if you can't get hold of any, or you could use finely chopped lemon thyme leaves.

Tip 3: This traybake can be stored in an airtight container for 3–4 days and frozen for up to a month.

COUNCILLOR'S UPDATE

Lockdown information: Given that the lockdown is still with us, though the emphasis is changing, I thought it would be useful to repeat the links and numbers through which you can seek help or information.

A helpline exists for frail or vulnerable residents who do not have support from families, friends or their local community, and who need urgent assistance with essential food or household supplies, collection of medication, or who are at risk of loneliness.

- The Coronavirus Hampshire Helpline – Hantshelp4vulnerable - can be contacted on 0333 370 4000. It is available seven days a week, from 9am-5pm.

Refuse Collection: There is no indication at the time of writing as to the

Borough Council's intended timescales for reintroducing the weekly grey bin collections. We therefore need to continue putting out our green bins on the normal recycling days, and the grey bins the following week. The Council advises wiping bin handles each time they are moved.

Household Waste Recycling Centre: the HWRC has re-opened specifically for people who cannot safely store their waste materials at home. Capacity has been reduced by new social distancing measures. Queues to get in were long in the first week, and it may be advisable to delay journeys there until the initial rush is over.

Anaerobic Digester: the Environment Agency is not taking further action regarding odour pollution at this time. The operators of the Digester are making changes to the plant in line with the EA's instructions but progress has been slowed due to the lockdown. This is deeply frustrating for local residents who continue to report problems and, locked in their homes, can't do anything to get away from it.

Biogen have been concerned about pedestrians using the plant's haul road. It is not a public right of way and takes some heavy lorries. New signs are being planned but, please, don't use the haul road for recreational purposes.

Hounsme Fields: the developers issued advance notice of their intention to start tree felling and this raised concerns about nesting birds and other ecological

issues. It appears that the agreed method of operating is for an ecologist to observe the site and identify any trees that are hosting nests, requiring these to be left until the chicks have fledged.

There is a question about the licence to fell in relation to dormice: at the time of writing this was being checked and, if a new licence is required, it will be sought. The developers have agreed to set up the protective fencing in readiness for felling but not to start until all issues have been resolved.

Domestic Abuse: One of our concerns, as Councillors, is that the lock-down will result in increased levels of domestic abuse. This may be suffered not only by adults but also by children, and it can be physical or emotional. Please be vigilant: if you think someone may be at risk, let the Police know.

Virtual Meetings: To end on a positive note, Hampshire's Cabinet held a formal meeting online in May with all Members and Officers joining via the internet. This saved many miles of travelling and it means that the Council's decision-making can continue in these difficult times. I hope this facility will become part of 'new normal'.

A JOB IN THE COMMUNITY (PART 2)

Hatch Warren resident, Simon Wright, gives a further insight into his role as a Registrar

Who built the Tower of London? Which King was executed in 1649? Where does haggis come from? I am confident on one of three, but may need to give some hard thought, and guessing, to the other two. These are three questions from last year's Citizenship test.

As I wrote last month, I am a Ceremonies Registration Officer; or Deputy Superintendent Registrar, based here in Basingstoke. In addition to conducting wedding and civil partnership ceremonies, one of my other main roles is to carry out Citizenship Ceremonies. The event marks the end of a very long road for people who have applied to become British Citizens, and it can be a very emotional occasion as they are finally able to apply for their British passports.

One of the tasks the applicants need to do before they get anywhere near the final ceremony is to undertake a written test on the subject of the United Kingdom. It takes a considerable amount of work to prepare for the exam, and even those of us who have been here since birth would need to do some serious thinking to come up with the correct answers.

Who led the team of scientists who split the atom for the first time? When did the Emancipation Act abolish slavery throughout the British Empire? I'm still not doing too well...

Participants are invited to attend the ceremony in the Registration Office in Basingstoke, which are held twice a month. There are around twenty applicants, together with their families, so it can be quite a big event! There are usually fifteen or so different nationalities, so a very diverse group of people from around the world.

During the ceremony, everyone must swear allegiance to Her Majesty the Queen, and to obey the laws of the United Kingdom. Everyone is also required to sing the first two verses of the National Anthem – probably the only time in their lives that they will ever have to sing any of the additional verses (there are six, by the way!).

As part of the ceremony, each person will receive their naturalisation certificate, which is the official legal document, and a commemorative certificate and pen (or teddy bear if you are a bit younger). These are presented by a civic dignitary – The High Sheriff, Lord Lieutenant, the Deputy Lieutenants and the Mayor all take turns to

OLD DOWN AND BEGGARWOOD WILDLIFE GROUP

This report is being written when we are still in lockdown but hopefully by the time you read it some restrictions will have been lifted. But it is unlikely that everyone will be back to school, college or work so there will still be many of you taking your daily walk across Old Down and Beggarwood and enjoying the early summer species. There seems to be a good number of the usual species of butterflies around – brimstone, small heath, red admiral, large white, speckled wood – to name just a few. Old Down is a recognized site for the small blue, generally around from late May, so do look out for these pretty butterflies. In May a couple of the Group members spotted a few green hairstreak flitting about on the dogwood on Beggarwood. This is not a common butterfly so is a really lovely and exciting sighting. It is not that easy to spot when it is resting as of course being green it blends in with the leaves.

Although butterfly species seem to be around in reasonable numbers, this has not been so for moths this year. This spring there has been a significant drop in all moth

species. This may be due to the heavy rain early on in the year and the floods at the end of last year, washing away caterpillars and pupa becoming waterlogged in the ground. One of the moth species that we know is found on Old Down is the elephant hawk-moth. This is a very pretty pink moth which lives around and feeds upon rose-bay willow herb. Many people think that all moths are dull brown but this is not so - many species are quite colourful and most have the most intricate patterns on their wings. There are only 59 species of butterflies in the UK but there are just over 2,500 species of moths. Another misconception is that moths eat clothes – only two species do this.







Spring in Lockdown

A Coronavirus does not stop Spring progressing. For those who can get out for a walk locally there are number of things to be thankful for. One is the silence, with fewer cars about, you are more aware of the sounds of nature. Bird song is always a joy, no more so than now.

With a wet winter, some of the woodland flower species have done well, none more so than the Wood Anemone (*Anemone nemorosa*). On a walk in very early April, some early Bluebells were spotted in local woods. Also when scouring the roadsides and hedgerows looking for spring flowers, a number of domestic "throwouts" have been spotted thriving. One example was a white Fritillary, pictured left. It was a "cultivar", as the native flower is mix of brown and mauve and is restricted to damp meadows. This example was spotted on a bank in a lane lined with houses on the outskirts of Oakley.



From a conservation perspective, these "cultivars", or introductions, are to be discouraged. They generally provide little in the way of nectar for early insects, big Daffodils and Spanish Bluebells being a case in point. In Down Grange Meadow, however, there is a clump of Honesty (*Lunaria annua*), pictured right, in the woodland belt by the walk-through from the rugby pitches. Honesty is the flower that produces the large transparent seed pods in autumn, beloved of flower arrangers. This patch has struggled over the years, but the wet winter has perked it up no end, both in terms of numbers and condition of the flowers. Honesty is a member of the cabbage family, so it was no surprise to see an Orange-tip butterfly nectaring on these flowers.


