BEGGARWOOD SURGERY NEWS FROM THE PPG

February 2022

Not a lot to report this month as it's early days since Operose/CGH has taken full responsibility for the running of our surgery. Early troubles have been reported in the merging of the NHS computer systems during the first couple of days causing a little disruption, but they seem to have been sorted by mid-week. Comments online have mainly been centred around hoping that Beggarwood continues to provide a level of service that we have come to expect over the last 2 years and does not slide down to the level seemingly being experienced with the rest of the Operose/CGH group in this area.

The staffing levels at Beggarwood remain stable and we have been reassured by Operose that they will not be diluting this by spreading the Beggarwood staff around the other surgeries. We have also been informed that we will continue to operate as a separate enterprise from the rest of the group and not have to share the systems that prevail in the other surgeries, in particular the telephone appointment system. We will continue monitoring this situation and working with Operose over the forthcoming months and years to ensure that we don't slip back into the kind of situation we had with the late Cedar group before NHUC took over. We will also maintain a close relationship with the NHS Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) and our local councillors and MP to help us along the way.

Rumours

It has been brought to our attention that an article published in one of the local Parish Magazines has mentioned that Operose may attempt to operate an American style medical insurance practice within Beggarwood. This is NOT the case and certainly outside of the scope of their contract with the NHS. Operose will continue to provide a full NHS service at Beggarwood and the CGH surgeries as with all the previous providers.

ENCOURAGING SCORE FOR COUNCIL'S CLIMATE CHANGE PLAN

Figures published by Climate Emergency UK have shown that the climate change action plan for Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council is ranked above the national average and scored second highest in the county.

The council's plan was assessed along with the plans from a total of 409 local authorities in the country and scored 54%, with the average for UK councils being 46%. In Hampshire, only Fareham Borough Council's plan scored more with 61%.

All UK councils' climate change action plans that were published online before 20 September 2021, and written after 2015, were assessed by a team of over 120 volunteers, trained and overseen by Climate Emergency UK, a not-for-profit co-operative. Each council was given a scorecard, with scores being based on councils' plans for actions to address the climate emergency, rather than reflecting steps already taken.

Cabinet Member for the Natural Environment and Climate Improvement ClIr Mark Ruffell said: "We are grateful to Climate Emergency UK for its hard work and pleased that our plan has scored well, with the assessment reflecting the balance of realistic and achievable actions in our ambitious plan while highlighting best practice examples for us to learn from and base future actions on.

"We'll be presenting our latest progress on delivering against our strategy and action plan to the Community, Environment and Partnerships Committee in March."

TIPS WHEN BUYING A NEW BUILD PROPERTY

Jo Francis, Senior Associate in Residential Property at Phillips, is a specialist with new build purchases, including purchases under the Help to Buy Scheme. Buying a new build has many benefits but, from the legal side, the conveyancing can be complex. The potential for something to go wrong is higher with a new build, which can be costly if not addressed. Jo fully understands what is required and highlights key points to consider:

- Ensure your finances are in order developers often insist finance for the mortgage is secured before contracts are exchanged.
- Most mortgages are only valid for six months, if completion is not within this period, you need to apply for an extension from your lender or you may have to reapply for the mortgage, depending on circumstances. However, some lenders offer specific new build mortgages lasting for 9 months.
- Check the property specification details carefully before reservation. Pay attention to the landscape drawings and development plans. Visit other sites built by the developer to see if the properties meet your requirements.
- Reservation fees are paid when making an

offer or a sale is agreed, ranging from £500 to £5,000 or more depending on property value and usually set for 28 days, covering the period leading to exchange of contracts. This fee is non-refundable, if you fail to exchange contracts in time or you decide to pull-out of purchasing. Your mortgage should be agreed in principle before making a reservation.

- A deposit is paid of 5% or 10% of the full purchase price, depending on whether the Help to Buy Equity Loan scheme is being used.
- Usually, mortgage lender valuations are taken at the beginning of a new build project but sometimes after construction is completed. A long period between exchange and completion could risk the property value decreasing, affecting the mortgage offer and amount your Lender agrees to lend you. You would still be contracted to purchase the property for the price agreed upon exchange.
- At completion, there will be an official handover. Ensure you are given copies of all the guarantees for the property.
- Before handover, check for defects, i.e. 'snagging', which the developer should rectify.

COUNCILLOR'S UPDATE

BEGGARWOOD SURGERY: there has been a lot of activity regarding the surgery this past month. The handover from North Hampshire Urgent Care to the Camrose/ Gillies/Hackwood partnership has taken place. This involved couple of days of computer downtime when the patient databases were being transferred but no large-scale disruption to the operation of the surgery, which is good.

BEGGARWOOD PPG: the Patient Participation Group issued an important statement at the end of January. They understand that CGH does not intend to change the way Beggarwood surgery runs. Staff at Beggarwood will continue to answer the phones, so the calls will not go to a central point as they do at CGH. CGH believes that all the non-medical and administration staff have opted to stay on and the outgoing Practice Manager said all staff were happy with the conversations they had had with CGH. It is also hoped that the salaried doctors and locums will continue. The PPG has impressed upon CGH that it wishes to operate as a separate PPG for the foreseeable future to monitor closely the level of service provided, and not be amalgamated into the wider CGH PPG. An open meeting with Maria Miller, our local MP, has been arranged for July 2022 to review the situation.

RUMOUR REBUTTED: the PPG has scotched (in no uncertain terms!), the suggestion that CGH/Operose might introduce an American-style insurancebased service. This is not allowed within their contract with the National Health Service.

PPG E-MAIL ADDRESS: To gather a wider patient view of Beggarwood Surgery, the PPG has decided to publish a non-medical email address that will be viewed by the PPG team. The idea is to give patients the opportunity to comment on issues such as the ease of booking appointments or call backs, the surgery waiting area environment, suggestions for improvements within the practice or feedback on recent interactions with the surgery. This initiative caused some internal debate: the risk is that people might put private medical details into this address and the PPG is made up of nonmedical 'lay' members. GRIT BIN: I am pleased to report that the new grit bin I requested has been installed in Gloucester Drive, which residents will know is quite a steep hill and potentially difficult in icy weather. This initiative was fraught with delay, not least because the bin was originally put in the wrong place!

COMMUNITY CENTRE ONE-WAY SYSTEM: the Hatch Warren Community Centre has had new signs installed to encourage drivers to respect its one-way system. The importance of this relates to child safety: the centre's car park is the recommended parking area for the school run to St Mark's Primary. Ill-disciplined drivers going the wrong way round the system can not only cause contention in the parking area but potentially put children at risk. The new signs are very clear

ROAD WORKS ONTHEA30: I attended a meeting about roads in Basingstoke and raised questions about monitoring the quality of work done by contractors who dig them up. In particular I wanted to put down a marker about the water main works on the A30. Who sets the standards and who checks that the road is reinstated in accordance with them? The answer was that the contractors are responsible for restoring the road to defined national standards and the work will be qualityinspected by Hampshire County Council as it progresses. I intend to monitor this.

BRIGHTON HILL ROUNDABOUT: | spoke at the Hampshire Cabinet meeting in favour of increasing the funding for the improvement works on the Brighton Hill roundabout. The cost is now expected to be slightly over £20 million. Work is well under way on the preparatory phase of the works. When work starts on the roundabout itself, the objective is to keep traffic flowing using traffic management. During peak hours (6:30am - 9:30am and 4pm - 6:30pm) the same number of lanes will be maintained on the A30 through the Brighton Hill Roundabout but the other entries (Western Way/The Harrow Way/Brighton Way/Winchester Rd) will be reduced to single lanes. Off peak, the contractor may require additional road space. Sadly, I predict that there will be delays. Interestingly, the contractors will be using recycled bio-fuel to reduce carbon dioxide emissions and will also be trialling electrically powered vehicles and plant during this construction.

TREES: I have seen questions on the local bulletin boards regarding replacement of the trees that have been removed as part of the roundabout works. My understanding is that they will all be replaced (+ 10%). The fact that the numbers will be maintained is good, but I don't think that is the whole story. Removing established habitats for wildlife is always sad and it will take many years for the new trees to grow to maturity.

RETAIL PARK: the expected planning application to convert the Brighton Hill retail park into warehousing / trade counters has been submitted to the Borough Council. If you want to view the documents, the application number is 22/00163/FUL.

HOUNSOME FIELDS ROUNDABOUT:

The roundabout that will serve Hounsome Fields and the Golf Course is now open, with some signage yet to be completed. The green space bordered by the new road and the A30 on the Basingstoke side is the site for the new primary school, and that is in the County Council's capital programme too. The road into Hounsome Fields is also one of the potential entrances to Manydown South when that is developed.

WAREHOUSES AT JUNCTION 7: At the time of writing, I am planning to attend a consultation being held by Newlands to discuss their revised plans for developing their site near Junction 7. This was the location where the believedto-be-Amazon warehouses were eventually turned down. It looks as if the new approach is scaled back from the four units that were previously proposed, and Newlands have trailed that LIDL are interested. I will want to find out what the impact might be on the potential hospital opposite and the traffic implications for the motorway junction and the A30 past Hatch Warren and Beggarwood.

JUBILEE CELEBRATIONS: I have been talking with the Community Association about plans for the Queen's jubilee. They are planning to combine the jubilee with the thirtieth Hatch Warren summer fair. You may want to think about street parties in your area, or other celebrations. After the two years we have all been through, I think we deserve to celebrate a little!

PROBUS HEARS HOW A PIECE OF STRING CONNECTS TO H-BOMB TEST

There will be many readers from the older generation who remember the nuclear bomb tests in 1957/8 that took place in the remote South Pacific on Montebello Islands, Malden Island and perhaps more famously, Christmas Island. David Stiles, the speaker at the latest meeting of the Probus Club of Basingstoke, while he was not one of the military personnel who witnessed the Hydrogen Bomb tests, was in the RAF but he was based in the tropical paradise of Hawaii.

Many aircraft in those days did not have the range to fly none-stop from the west coast of USA to the H-Bomb test islands. The USAF Hickman base near Honolulu on Oahu in the Hawaii islands, 1,335 miles away, became a staging post for aircraft on their flights to and from the nuclear test sites. The speaker was posted to this paradise purely because he was a specialist instrument and avionics engineer.

The RAF used Handley Page Hastings aircraft, introduced after WW2, as both cargo transporters and troop carriers. One day a Hastings, en route to Christmas Island, arrived with a top-secret VIC. This turned out to be Vitally Important Cargo. A large bulbous object was lashed securely with a tarpaulin cover that had its fastenings wax sealed. The pilot claimed not to know what it was, but most people had thoughts that it was needed for an H-Bomb test due in a few days' time.

The plane had arrived later than expected. The reason, as explained with fruitful language by the pilot, was that there was something seriously amiss with the navigational equipment that had forced the plane off course several times resulting in extended flight time. The plane was fitted with a dual system of a magnetic compass and a giro compass. A magnetic compass would behave differently the closer the plane flew to the north pole and the giro compass was there to counteract this action. On this flight it had proved impossible to make manual adjustments and the plane had veered considerably off its flight plan.

The speaker was charged with rectifying the problem and went through a series of procedures including having the aircraft physically moved around to check the compass readings which proved accurate. At the upper end of the port wing was a small square hatch cover over an electronic device whose purpose was to use signals to synchronise the giro compass to maintain a true heading. This equipment was held in position with small nuts on its underside which made it difficult to remove for inspection. In order not to drop the tiny spanner used for undoing and tightening the nuts in this very difficult

position, and working by feel only, a piece of string was tied to the little spanner and looped on to his little finger so that if dropped the spanner could be easily recovered.



After several frustratingly unsuccessful attempts at undoing one of the small nuts the little spanner slipped from his grasp. Aghast, he realised the safety string had inadvertently come off his finger. Now both string and spanner were lost but had to be found.

Feeling blindly into the dark abyss, he miraculously discovered not only the tiny spanner and string, but another huge spanner not remotely used in that area, but in the engine bay 30 feet away. How come



this large spanner was under the detector unit causing huge magnetic errors for the gyro compass? Each time the aircraft banked the large spanner moved, causing yet further errors.

Ironically, by accidentally losing his little spanner and string, he discovered something that could have seriously jeopardised the plane, that Vitally Important Cargo and the testing of an H-Bomb.

The questions then centred on how did the spanner get into the sealed cavity at the end of the wing? It was the size and type used on the plane's engine maintenance, but it could not have slid along inside the wing as the fuel tanks completely blocked any access.

Was it sabotage? Enquiries were no doubt carried out, but no findings were passed down to this RAF NCO. His reward was to receive a promotion and eventually be returned to UK duties working on Victors, part of the V bomber force in place during the cold war.

Perhaps enemy forces had hoped that by creating navigational problems the longer flight time would have caused the plane to run out of fuel and crash into the Pacific Ocean. Two days after finding the spanner the final H-Bomb test took place on Christmas Island. Would this have happened if a tiny spanner tied to the end of a piece of string had not solved the navigational problem?

Return of an Old Friend

On New Year's Day, a couple of our members out for quiet walk saw a Green Woodpecker foraging in Down

Grange Meadow. Green Woodpeckers were once regularly seen around the back of St Mark's Church but they have not been spotted for some time, so it's good to see one back. This is a shy bird more heard than seen.

Its call is a distinctive laughing sound that gives rise to it's country name of "Yaffle". It is also a solitary bird outside of the breeding season, so it was lucky to get such a good view. Even in dull and overcast conditions, the red head was distinctive. As their main



food is ants they rarely come to bird tables, but during Winter they will forage for worms and grubs hiding in leaf litter.

Last year was a good year for ants in the Meadow and there have been some quite spectacular ants' nests. By the end of summer, there were a number over half a metre high and wide, certainly big

enough to trip up the unwary.



HELLO FROM SIMON SAYS CHILD BEREAVEMENT SUPPORT

We are a registered charity supporting Hampshire children and young people up to the age of 18 years who have a significant person in their life who has died or is dying. The death of someone important can have a devastating effect but we know that given support children and young people can be helped to understand what has happened and assisted to rebuild their lives.

Our support groups across Hampshire offer children, young people and their families the opportunity to work through what has happened. These sessions are important as they help children and young people to normalise their grief and realise they are not alone.

We host a **Basingstoke** support group once a month in Hatch Warren. It is free of charge to access once registered and can be accessed for as many sessions as you need. Accompanying adults stay onsite and can seek the advice of our volunteers and find peer to peer support. Refreshments are available.

The session is set up depending on the age of the child. Our Basingstoke children's group is for those aged up to 1/12 years and our Basingstoke Young Peoples Group is for those aged 11/18 years. A typical children's group will use planned craft activities, games and stories to focus on common themes of thoughts, feelings and emotions related to death and dying e.g., sadness, anger, guilt and memories. Young people are encouraged to engage in shared aspects of their stories to support them in working through feelings and emotions.

CGH News

CGH have just over 42,000 patients, and average 2,035 appointments a week, by telephone and face to face. Wait time for new appointments is currently 10 working days. Recruitment continues, with three extra GPs joining in February and March, plus a Nurse, and Health Care Assistant, together with more experienced reception staff and an adapted training programme to improve efficiency in answering patient calls. This will bring the total number of medical staff to 24 GPs (including 7 regular locums), 5 Nurse Practitioners, 2 Paramedics, 4 Pharmacists and I Physician's Associate. CGH is now a Living Wage employer accredited by the Living Wage Foundation, and have pledged to always pay staff 10% above the national Living Wage to help recruit and retain staff. The CGH feedback and Complaints Manager is Wayne Robinson. If he knows what problems there are, he is able to help. Patients can complete the feedback form on the CGH website for the matter to be resolved.

Good partnerships

What good partnerships do you know about? I'm showing my age if I mention Cagney & Lacey, Morecambe & Wise. Some even older, such as Gallagher & Lyle and Flanagan & Allen. Or some modern ones...Posh & Becks, Michelle & Barack, Kate & William....

Maybe you can think of others? And the best thing about them is that although they are individuals they are so much more together.

At the time you are reading this, there should be another partnership in place, technically called a pastoral reorganisation (you may have heard of this in previous editions of the Rabbiter). Immanuel Church in Hatch Warren & Beggarwood and St Mark's in Kempshott will join to form a new parish called Basingstoke Down.

Although the name of the Parish will be different you probably won't notice any other changes. The Parish of Basingstoke Down will continue to serve the communities of Hatch Warren, Beggarwood, and Kempshott just as it previously had. And as more housing is built on both sides of the A30 we will be serving those too.

Both churches hold Worship services every Sunday and we would love you to join us - even if you have never been before. Our services plus other activities and events will be advertised on our new website www.parishofbasingstokedown.org.uk and our Facebook page. We are here to support the whole community through prayer, worship and fun activities such as an Easter Messy Church (on April 9th). We are also here to answer those big questions in life about God and faith, and how important that is to people today. This past year has demonstrated how interconnected we all are to each other.

The two parishes were originally interconnected, Hatch Warren & Beggarwood grew out of the parish of Kempshott. Immanuel Church was a church planted by the Methodist and URC working together with St Mark's Church, Kempshott. For those of you who went to St Mark's school or have children there that's why the school is called St Mark's – it's named after the original parish as it once was. The name of the new parish has historic roots. One of our church wardens conducted extensive research and found the area we now know as Kempshott was, for several centuries, part of a larger area of common grazing land known as Basingstoke Down. In the Bible St Paul speaks about how the people who believe in God are connected to each other. He compares this to a body – each part of the body is useful and one part cannot reject another or say that it is better. This connection to each . is the same in a community too. Coretta Scott King (wife of

Martin Luther King) said "The greatness of a community is most accurately measured by the compassionate actions of • . its members".

So, for this year 2022 and beyond may we the parish of Basingstoke Down and the communities of Hatch Warren, Beggarwood and Kempshott be connected to and compassionate with each other.

There has been a great deal of publicity about adults who struggle to read as a result of Repair Shop presenter, Jay Blades, taking part in a recent BBC documentary This follows his journey as he faces up to the challenge of learning to read as an adult with his local branch of Read Easy, and in particular, his remarkably patient and encouraging Volunteer Coach, Emma.

In the Basingstoke & Deane Council area, we have been helping adults with their reading skills for the past two and a half years, and we have seen at first-hand what a difference that learning to read makes. We have had a number of our Readers now graduate from the Read Easy programme. One of these, Paul from Tadley, only learnt to read in his 40s and is now encouraging others who may be struggling, to ask for help. He wanted to make his wife and daughter proud, and he has certainly achieved that. Another, Joelma, is so pleased to be able to help her children with their homework, and a third Reader says that learning to read "is the best thing that's ever happened to me". We are very proud of all of our Readers.

We have trained Volunteer Coaches ready and waiting to help, providing free one-to-one reading coaching for adults who are unable to read or who find it difficult. Eating places in garden centres have become successful in pulling in customers in the hope that increased footfall will add to the sale of garden products and the household items that sustain out of season business.

Conkers, the family run garden centre on the A30 at Old Basing have had their River Bank named restaurant for several years and Madam and I had lunch there on a Wednesday. It turned out that arriving just after 12.30 pm was rush hour because all twenty odd tables were occupied, and we had to queue for some time before we were seated. Clearly a popular place.

They have quite an extensive menu offering from hot meals through to sandwiches and a daily specials board that on this visit was offering Hunter's chicken and chocolate brownies amongst other treats. We both selected from the standard menu with Madam having fish cakes that came with a mixed salad and chunky chips. The two large salmon fish cakes had a cheese centre and were very filling.

I had traditional ham, eggs and chips, or as the menu described them as gourmet fries. Other places might call them triple cooked chunky chips, but as the bard said, "a rose by any other name would smell just as sweet." The quality was very acceptable.

I had a large slice of coffee and walnut cake, but Madan needed nothing more having wished that she had asked for a doggy bag to take home the second fishcake.

Although the establishment has a drinks licence we kept our selection simple with Earl Grey tea with lemon for Madam that came in a deceptively capacious pot that provided her with almost four cups, whilst I had a diet Coke.

Simple enough fare and worth the money at a total of £27.39p

Brunch to afternoon cake and tea extends their attraction for popping in when passing and the range of gift items in the extensive shop makes for pleasant browsing.




